- Proposal for "Appreciation Award" to the faculty members of the college for publication of their research work in SCI Journals is under favourable consideration.
- A Proposal by research cell of the college for "Monthly Seminar" on research topic by the faculty members is approved.

 The "Library", "Technical and IT" and "Building Construction" committees are in place to address the relevant issues for maintenance and up gradation and renovation.
