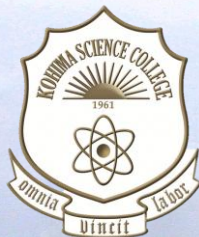

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- All the nine honours classes are fitted with LAN linked interactive smart boards to enhance teaching learning experience . Other class room will also be linked soon.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The College follows the semester systems. The students are assessed internally and externally as well. The internal assessment is continuous with 30% weightage in the end term exam.
- Under autonomous status, separate exam branch is established headed by the “Controller of Examination”.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- A eight member “Research Cell” is constituted and it is actively engage to improve the research environment in the college.
- Publication of a research Journal, entitled “ RUSIE : A JOURNAL OF CONTEMPORARY SCIENTIFIC, ACADEMIC AND SOCIAL ISSUES” with ISSN No (2348-0637) was released.
- Proposal for “Appreciation Award” to the faculty members of the college for publication of their research work in SCI Journals is under favourable consideration.
- A Proposal by research cell of the college for “Monthly Seminar “ on research topic by the faculty members is approved.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The “Library”, “Technical and IT” and “ Building Construction “ committees are in place to address the relevant issues for maintenance and up gradation and renovation.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The Human Resource Management in the college is in the form of a collective relationship between Head of the Institute and employees. Under the new system of autonomous status w.e.f 2014 -15 to 2019-20, the following statutory bodies are established : (i). College Governing body (ii) Academic Council (iii) Board of studies. And (iv) Finance Committee
- A seven members + Head of the Department (Nos: Ten) IQAC, headed by Principal of the college is in place for overall planning and development of the college.
- The follow up action of IQAC planning and recommendation in relation to governance , management and development is carried out by the following committees of the college: (i) College Development committee (ii) Examination committee (iii) Research and Consultancy committee (iv) Admission Committee (v) Library committee (vi) Building Construction committee (vi) RUSA coordination and monitoring committee (vii) Technical and IT committee (viii) Event management Committee.

- The follow up action for student related activities are addressed by the following committees : (i) Student monitoring /mentoring committee (ii) Career guidance and Student Counselling committee (iii) Students' Grievance Redressal committee (iv) Remedial Coaching committee (v) Literary committee (vi) Disciplinary and anti Ragging committee.
- The Kohima Science College Teachers Association (KSCTA) is active to address the teacher's cause and welfare.
- The Kohima Science college Students Union is an interface body with the college administration for the welfare of the students.
- The General Academic Council is a platform to discuss college related issues between college administration and faculty members.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Faculty recruitment is through the Nagaland Public Service Commission (NPSC). The recruitment of faculty member is as per the UGC regulation (on minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of the standard in higher education, 2010).

The staff recruitment is as per the service rule of the Govt. of Nagaland.
